Location: This cemetery has not been located. It isn't on a tract map, but is described as being on the north side of Emory Valley Road, 1,000 feet west of River Road, near the intersection of "old road F-81". This may be the cemetery that is reported to be in the vicinity of Balboa Circle. On Tract D-367, from Harvey Gray.

2012 Update: Location: This cemetery is located on private property between 105 and 107 Balboa Circle. Although not identified on a tract map it is identified on the U. S. Engineer Office, Manhattan District Index of Road Map Status of Construction (Cemetery) Drawing revised 1943/1945. This map identifies the cemetery as the Gray cemetery, #55, which can be cross referenced to the Gray D-367 tract map. Additionally, some of the original deteriorated wooden fence posts possibly installed by the U. S. Army still stand today encircling this small cemetery.
